The Monroe County Sheriff's Foundation (MCSF) is a non-profit organization established in 1991 to fund special Monroe County Sheriff's Office projects and programs that cannot be covered by taxpayer funding alone. Our Foundation helps enhance Community Service programs focused on crime prevention, drug and alcohol awareness, and safety education. We also provide funding for specialized equipment that aids the Sheriff's Office in crime investigation, public safety services, and the Sheriff's Communications Office. Our primary fundraisers are the annual Golf Classic held in July and the fall time annual Pig Roast. We pride ourselves on being the ONLY Foundation that gives 100% of our donations directly to the Monroe County Sheriff's Office, ensuring your generous support stays right here in our community. The MCSFD provides financial support for projects beyond the scope of the county budget, ensuring officers have what they need for community safety and effectiveness. It funds youth programs (safety education, summer camp), crime prevention, and initiatives like the ROCTAC (threat assessment) program. It invests in deputy wellness, training, morale, and specialized gear for investigations and public safety. It supports new tech, such as the Drone as a First Responder program, requiring infrastructure investment.

MCSF 2nd Annual Pig Roast Raises Funds for Deputies


The MCSF held its 2nd Annual Pig Roast on October 19th at Tony D's Restaurant on University Avenue.

Advancements in technology have reshaped how criminals are committing crimes and how police are preventing and investigating these crimes.

Today's police officers face a mountain of requirements for evidence collection, analysis and storage, all with unrealistic timelines to present for trial.

Some of the technology includes Body Worn Cameras and Dash Cameras; Tasers; License Plate Readers and Public Safety Cameras; and now added to the list is the Drone as a First Responder Program and the Regional Investigative Operations Center (RIOC).

Key Benefits of a Drone as a First Responder (DFR) Program Include:

- Faster response times with the ability to deploy remotely piloted drones to emergency calls, arriving alongside or before traditional responders
- Increased officer safety by providing better situational awareness and reducing unnecessary risks
- Reduced strain on resources by providing real-time data for better resource allocation
- Enhanced coordination between the RIOC and first responders in the field
- Potential for de-escalation through live video feeds that allow communication in tense situations

 - Making the best possible decisions based on the most accurate information available
 - Links decision makers with technological resources
 - Integrating technology to be more proactive and to operate more safely

 - Domestic Violent Extremism – **Threat Assessment and Management - ROCTAC**
 - **Multijurisdictional crime patterns** that demand extra resources and coordination
 - Community Wide Hazards – Blizzards, Flooding, Wind Events
- RIOC has both **command and coordination capability** when necessary:
 - Ample space and tech to assist with coordination efforts across multiple agencies and disciplines
 - Helps Leaders develop and implement strategy by applying technology and sharing resources
 - Links to Schools, EOC, Unified Command Post, 911, MCAC, Local and State Government
